### Time to Renew!

It's that time again! Each spring, current NT-AAUW members have the opportunity to renew their commitment to our branch and to our various projects. During the week of May 14<sup>th</sup> (or sooner) you will receive a personalized renewal form, renewal information, and an envelope for you to return to us with your form, membership dues, and donation checks. Please review your personal contact information and make any needed changes. This is how we keep an accurate membership database. We need to receive your renewal form, dues, and donation checks by June 30<sup>th</sup> so that we can update our database and verify our data with the national AAUW database.

Here is some brief information about where your dues and donation checks go:

 Each of us pays a total of \$100 in dues, unless you are a dual member. Of that money, \$49 goes to national, \$20 goes to the California chapter, and \$31 stays here in our branch to cover our administrative expenses.

- In addition to your dues, you can donate to one or more of our branch projects devoted to promoting educational opportunities for local area young women. There are three such projects: Tech Trek, Girls State, and High School Scholarships.
  - Tech Trek is a joint effort with Kiwanis, Tahoe Rotary and TLC. Our total commitment to this project is \$5400, which pays for six girls to attend the week-long STEM camp at UC Davis.
  - Your donation to Girls State sponsors a girl to attend a weeklong intense legislative experience here in California. This project is a joint effort with the South Tahoe American Legion Auxiliary and costs \$500 for her participation.
  - Lastly, we offer a \$1000 college scholarship to a young woman graduating this year from North Tahoe High School.

Last year, the Leadership Team suggested that each member, who so desires, donates \$100 in addition to their dues. This would eliminate the need for constant fundraising throughout the year. Many members accepted our suggestion and more than few surprised us with generous gifts far above the suggested amount. We are grateful to all our members for their positive responses to our request. The donations made at renewal time last year covered almost 100% of the needed contributions to fund our projects. This made our year more productive and we all share a sense of satisfaction and fulfillment in being able to carry out all our projects to the fullest. Thank you!
