Mr. Mitchell took us on a short walk to a large boulder where two families from the Donner party built a cabin and lived during that horrible winter. He helped us envision how 18 members of those families coped with the struggles to survive. He truly made the history come alive. Thanks to Mr. Mitchell for a great presentation and thanks to Trudy and Johnnie Lee for planning the program.
