

General Meeting September 8, 2016 Tahoe Yacht Club

Ken Yagura accompanied his wife who is recovering from an illness. One mother of our current Tech Trekers and the mother of the Girls' State participant also attended. A salad luncheon was provided to honor these young ladies who were able to attend this science camp at UC Davis in Davis, CA, in July. As lunch was eaten, Meri McEneny spoke about each Tech Treker and projected a slide that showed the schedule for the girls this summer and photos of some of the campers participating in various classes that were taken by Meri on Visitor Day. Meri also read a letter from the Tech Treker who has moved away and was unable to attend our luncheon. Each of the Tech Treker girls stood and gave very interesting speeches following their introductions. The girls gave very engaging speeches using cue cards rather than reading their speeches. All of our members enjoyed hearing about the girls' experiences. Meri also explained that she would like to sponsor a local day focused on STEM that includes all Tech Trekers and applicants through their high school careers.

Johnnie Lee introduced our candidate for this year's Girls' State, Ella Barzel. She is a senior this year at North Tahoe High School. She gave an extremely articulate speech describing her experience at this camp. She indicated that she would like a career in politics so found this camp very helpful.
