GENERAL MEETING

Our March meeting will be held on <u>Thursday, March</u> 8th, at The Gatekeeper's Museum at 1pm.

The team behind the North Tahoe Truckee Transport Seniors shuttle bus will share a fun 15 minute-presentation to inform our members about this FREE but under-utilized service. They need to get the word out to ensure that their grant funding will continue for the next three years. They are in their 4th year of operation and have expanded service thanks to a new partnership with Tahoe Forest Hospital.

Following the talk by NTTT is one of the most popular meetings of the year, **Chautauqua**. This event is open to the public and in the past, presentations have been so outstanding as to encourage people to join AAUW NT. There will also be an opportunity to share information about some fearless pioneers who changed the world and to snack on cookies. The Gatekeeper's Museum is located at 130 West Lake Blvd, Tahoe City.



Chautauqua was an adult education movement in the U.S., highly popular in the late 19th and early 20th centuries. The Chautauqua brought entertainment and culture for the whole community with speakers, teachers, musicians, entertainers, preachers, and specialists of the

day. Former U.S. President <u>Theodore Roosevelt</u> was quoted as saying that Chautauqua is "the most American thing in America".

The first or "mother" Chautauqua was organized in 1874 at a campsite on the shores of Chautauqua Lake in NY State. The educational summer camp format proved to be a popular choice for families and was widely copied by the "daughter" Chautaquas. Within a decade, Chautauqua assemblies (or Chautauquas) sprang up in various locations across North America.

The popularity of the Chautauqua movement can be attributed in part to the social and geographic isolation of American farming and ranching communities. People in such areas would naturally be hungry for education, culture and entertainment, and the Chautauqua Movement was a timely response to that need in the late 19th century and early 20th century.



On February 15th, our Tech Trek interview committee of <u>Christine Madden</u>, <u>Joan O'Lear</u> and <u>Meri McEneny</u> spent a good day in the conference room at North Tahoe High School with 7 smart, talented and eager 7th grade girls nominated for the 2018 UCD camp. Tech Trek Donation Change

After a two-year trial period, AAUW national office has returned administration of the ten California Tech Trek camps to AAUW California. The <u>AAUW California Special Projects Fund</u> (SPF) now serves as the fiscal agency. Since SPF is recognized by the Internal Revenue Service as a 501(c)(3) entity, donations are tax deductible. Branch members and other donors should follow the following steps in order to make tax exempt donations to Tech Trek:

- □ Write your checks payable to **AAUW CA SPF**.
- ☐ Give your checks to your branch treasurer or other assigned branch officer.

The branch treasurer will send your donation to the treasurer of the Tech Trek Camp where you are sending your campers. The camp treasurer will process and submit the donations to SPF for deposit. SPF will acknowledge all donations of \$250 or more. Branches will acknowledge donations of \$249 or less.

This means we will go back to the way it was a few years ago. Tech Trek donations will be handled as above, written to AAUW CA SPF. Donation checks written directly to AAUW Fund or any of the participating funds i.e, Eleanor Roosevelt, will only count toward our <u>named gift honoree</u> and not to Teck Trek. We can no longer rely on our Teck Trek funds to qualify us for a named gift honoree. Information will be provided at renewal time. Any questions, please contact Nancy Cline, nhcline@gmail.com

Just a heads up -- at the 2016 spring meeting, the AAUW National Board of Directors voted to increase the yearly national dues from \$49 to \$59. This increase goes into effect on March 16, 2018 and is the first time in over a decade that the AAUW national dues have increased. A combination of dues, donations, and corporate and foundation funding is critical to supporting AAUW's work to advance equity for women and girls. Our dues support salary negotiation workshops, groundbreaking research, advocacy efforts, campus leadership programs, and so much more! This \$10 increase means that the national dues portion of our membership renewal will increase from \$49 to \$59, resulting in total renewal dues of \$110 including our state and local dues, which will remain the same. A bargain, when you think about it! We will be updating our renewal

form to reflect the increase in national dues before we send out renewal notices in May.
