April Shackelford – Forester at North Lake Tahoe Fire Protection District



April has been interested in forests since a very early age. Growing up in the central valley of CA, but spending summers in the Stanislaus National Forest made forests special places to visit. She followed a forestry and environmental science path in school to better understand these special places and their functions, and to be better suited for a career where she

may be able to improve their condition. Eventually earning Associates, Bachelors, and Masters degrees in this field, she found employment with the North Lake Tahoe Fire Protection District (NLTFPD) where she is able to seek funding and apply it to fuels reduction projects which also greatly improve forest health and ecosystem function.

Her master's thesis looked at the effects of fuel moisture on consumption rates and chemical speciation of carbon and nitrogen in smoke and in soils. The prescribed fire she used for her study was conducted by NLTFPD. She has conducted a monitoring assessment of lands owned by IVGID to better assess fuel loading and the effects of the prescribed fire program managed by NLTFPD and has been able to apply and develop her skills with Arc GIS mapping software. She works with homeowners to improve defensible space compliance and has come to understand a lot about Lake Tahoe and regional forests, and the concerns of residents in the Wildland Urban Interface. She is inspired to continue doing fuels reduction work to improve forest health and protect communities.
