## **CO-PRESIDENTS MESSAGE**

Why does AAUW matter? This is the question that all levels of our organization – national, state, and local branches – need to answer. National AAUW responded with a comprehensive review of its goals and operations to develop a new strategic plan to refine its focus on education and training, economic security, and leadership. All the while, National AAUW will strive to incorporate best practices to enhance governance and sustainability of the organization.

Take a moment to contemplate why our branch – AAUW North Tahoe – matters. How can we sharpen our focus on the things that matter?

Our branch voted in the Spring to increase local scholarships from a one-year grant of \$1,000 to a four-year grant of \$5,000 to a female high school graduate who pursues <u>STEM college studies</u>. **Ellen Magnani** and **Kathie Julian** will lead our efforts to screen applicants and select our scholarship winner. Many thanks for their efforts to increase AAUW North Tahoe's impact on local girls.

The words "defensible space" bear repeating over and over during red flag fire-sensitive months. April Shackleford of North Lake Tahoe Fire Protection District reminded us of ways to protect our property and loved ones. The before and after photos of Lake Tahoe's timbered areas were fascinating, and April related forest growth to fire dangers.

Both Sierra College in Truckee and Sierra Nevada
College in Incline Village are local AAUW
college/university partners. All students are allowed
free e-memberships and two of the campus
representatives can join AAUW branches. We expect
to improve our partnerships with these local colleges
and reach out to younger, more diverse members.
Sierra College asks us to mentor their students. Do
you have a special talent/skill that you can impart to

information. Branch leaders will schedule a day on
the Sierra Nevada College campus to sign up student
members to AAUW memberships and to vote. Look
for dates and plan to join the registration event.

This 3<sup>rd</sup> annual event is scheduled at the **Tahoe Environmental Research Center (TERC)** in Incline
Village who offered a reduced rental rate and to cosponsor the event. The day will involve members
(and ideas!) from 5 local AAUW branches: North
Tahoe, Tahoe Nevada, Truckee-Donner, South Shore,
and Reno. We will invite girls from the 4 Tahoe
Truckee branches.

Thank you, Nevada Tahoe branch president Judith Miller, for recruiting speaker Kim Popovits who is the President and CEO of Genomic Health in the Bay area. Esmeralda Clark, Clinical Nurse Instructor at UNLV School of Nursing has put us on her schedule! Reno branch member Robbyn Tolles is helping recruit a speaker from the UNR Medical School, from where she retired in 2016; and she has some great ideas for the day!

This month, Patricia and Meri submitted a grant application to the **Tahoe Truckee Community Foundation** in the category of <u>Youth Development</u> and applied to <u>AAUW-CA Special Projects Fund</u> (SPF) to administer the grant. TTCF requires a 501 (c) 3 foundation to administer the grant, if awarded, and SPF agreed to accept our branch application to administer TTCF monies if we are granted.

In the TTCF grant, we request \$5,000 for STEM Trek day June 8, 2019; with an additional \$700 allocated from our branch. The TERC facility requires outside catering (first rights go to the food services at Sierra Nevada College) and we anticipate up to 80 girls and women at the event, therefore the grant request.

Thank you, members, for supporting STEM Trek day. Next year's event is going to be phenomenal!
