2019 Tech Trek nominations forms have been submitted by 7th grade teachers Lindee Eckert and Lisa McCready. Each teacher submitted 5 nominees for camp, but after nominations were received, 2 girls declined to apply. Meri met with the 8 other nominees at school to explain and distribute the application forms that include an essay prompt. Completed forms are due <u>February 7</u>.

This year, the 2-pronged prompt may be answered as an essay, poem, interview or journal, in 400-500 words. Mrs. Eckert created a Google Classroom online forum that the girls, the teachers, and I can access to distribute and receive forms, updates and completed applications and essays.

On <u>February 13</u>, **Christine Madden**, **Priscilla Mills**, **Sharon Filardo** and **Meri** will conduct interviews at the school. Thank you, committee members!

Branch coordinators for UC Davis camp met in Sacramento on Sunday, January 6 (what a storm day!). Besides clarifying this year's protocols, we discussed:

 Allowing nominated girls to answer the essay question as an interview, journal, poem or traditional essay, whichever lets them express themselves best.
To better track girls after camp, ask members of our interview team to track a specific girl to stay in contact with through school.

3. To increase local knowledge about Tech Trek, invite a local news source to interview the girls after camp.

Junior Counselor at Tech Trek:

Seven former North Tahoe Tech Trek campers, now in high school, have requested applications for Junior Counselor positions for TT. Camp coordinators select 8 JC's from throughout Northern California branches; names will be announced by April 1, 2019.

Our Tech Trek grant request to Rotary of Tahoe City was submitted this month.

STEM Trek day June 8, 2019, now has two foci for the day, reflected in our new working title: *Women Solving Medical Mysteries & Exploring Space*. Our own 2005 TT alum Julia Levy will be speaking. Julia works for <u>Virgin Orbit</u> which is paying for her travel costs to attend. SNC Food services will be closed on June 8, so our task now is to secure a licensed food provider for breakfast and lunch items. Also, during the Medical Mystery segment, each team of girls will ideally have tablets or laptops for research related to the hypothetical medical case. Our committee is preparing to request a grant to pay for rental costs (~ \$1,000).
