From throughout our region, we have **45 girls** signed up, and **40 women**, including UCD Tech Trek coordinators, and my favorites, <u>NTS teachers</u> **Lisa McCready** and **Lindee Eckert!** The South Lake branch has received two local grants for a total of \$500. This, and contributions from ours and other branches, total \$1,800, and we are Right On Budget! Our generous members have paid for meals for our 15 North Tahoe girls attending. Thank you sincerely!

AAUW branches joining to hold STEM TREK workshops

INCLINE VILLAGE, Nev. — Four branches of the American Association of University Women (AAUW) are collaborating this year to hold a STEM TREK Day of workshops at the UC Davis Tahoe Environmental Research Center.

This event is free for girls ages 12 through high school who live throughout the Tahoe Basin. It will take place June 8 in the TERC building, located on the campus of Sierra Nevada College in Incline Village. Organizers say the event promises an exciting opportunity for girls to relate to this year's theme: Women Solving Medical Mysteries and Exploring

"Women are still hugely underrepresented in engineering and computer science," Judy Miller, president of AAUW Tahoe-Nevada chapter, said in a press release. "In fact, women earn less than 20% of the degrees in these two areas. We're encouraging girls in our area to pursue these studies by holding this STEM Trek Day here on the North Shore."

"For the first time, four AAUW branch affiliates around Lake Tahoe are joining forces to support our young women with a rich and evocative Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math (STEM) day," Debra Tufts, a member of the AAUW Tahoe-Nevada branch based in Incline Village, said in the press release. "The event is open to all girls aged 12

through High School in Lake Tahoe and Truckee schools, home school, and public school at home programs. The objective is to excite, ignite and rewire girls' conventional career choice thinking by exposing them to several STEM careers."

Six professionals will illustrate their career journeys, teach science and generate future possibilities in a day of hands-on experiments, lectures and journaling.

Pre-registration is necessary as space is limited. Participants will enjoy a full day of presentations and workshops, starting with check-in and a provided breakfast at 8:30 a.m. Lunch also is provided.

Presenters include a medical school doctor, a clinical nurse university instructor, the CEO of genomics, an applied physics lab and NASA SW engineer, a propulsion engineer, and environmental protection educators. The program also will highlight learning styles to reach participants through multiple senses. The day ends about 3:30 p.m.

Attendees gathered at Lake Tahoe AleWorX April 25 to enjoy appetizers, selfpoured beer and wine, and


live music from Adam Bergoch on the patio.
