Working with two new 7th grade Science and Math teachers at North Tahoe School to nominate girls may be a challenge this winter, but I think they will see the value of the program. Once school begins, I will introduce myself and invite them to our October social event where our Tech Trek girls speak to our branch about their camp experience. 

Tech Trek 2019 was an incredible experience for everyone involved! This week of STEM education gave 94 twelve and thirteen-year-old girls unparalleled opportunities to dabble in different non-humanities fields.

Our North Tahoe AAUW branch hosted 5 local girls. They lived in a dorm at UC Davis with their dorm moms and junior counselors, ate in the dining commons, and got a taste of college life. Every morning the girls attended a core class of 3-D math, genetics, engineering, anatomy/physiology, or computer science. The afternoons and evenings were filled with workshops in such diverse subjects as physics, veterinary science, space travel, personal finance, chemistry, forensics, self-esteem, and sound technology.

There were also mingling sessions with women in STEM fields, giving the girls a chance to see what life is like for real women scientists, engineers, and mathematicians. These activities were interspersed with a variety of fun bonding activities. Plenty of friendships were established, complete with giggling, nicknames, and contact numbers exchanged.
