


BRIDGE

Transactions (Revenues/Expenditures) highlights through Dec 31, 2019:

- 1. Operating Funds
 - a. Membership. 63 of our 65 members pay branch dues. Honorary life members do not pay branch dues; paid life members do pay branch dues. (63*\$31 dues = \$1,953)
 - b. Social Events.
 - i. Summer party net proceeds \$320
 - ii. Petra net proceeds \$522.50.
 - iii. Holiday party net proceeds \$0.

2. Program Funds

- a. Tech Trek (Funds held at AAUW-CA Tech Trek SPF). Allen Foundation contribution of \$1,000 brings branch funding to \$7,771. Sufficient to pay \$4,500 fees for 5 campers.
- b. Scholarships (Funds held at TTCF and TTCSC). \$7,970 funding is sufficient to fund \$4,000 scholarships (\$2k+\$1k+\$1k) at end of FY.
- c. Girls State (Funds held at ALA and TTCF). \$580 funding sufficient for \$450 travel stipend. (ALA carryover covers fees)
- d. AAUW Fund (Funds held at AAUW National). CY contributions of \$1,531.50 sufficient for 2 named gift awards.
