Dear Members,

I want to confirm the FY 2019-20 Financial Statements were reviewed according to Branch Bylaws.

Branch Bylaw Article XIII. Financial Administration, Section 2. Financial Policies -"Financial statements will be reviewed annually."

Accordingly, **Kym Pipkin**, current Co-President and past Finance Officer, reviewed FY 2019-20 Branch financial records and found them consistent with Bank of the West, Vanguard Money Market Account, and Tahoe Truckee Community Foundation statements for the same period.

Thank you again for your generous contributions to our Branch operations and mission-based programs.

I want to give you a brief update on the status of our accounts as we move through the fourth month of our fiscal year (FY).

We approved the 2020-21 FY budget in April 2020 before we knew much about the COVID19 impact on our Branch activities. Virtually all of our meetings are now virtual. (I couldn't resist that double-entendre). Accordingly, the branch's operating expenses for speakers, venues, and meeting supplies are considerably

reduced, as we hold meetings with our monthly \$14.99 Zoom subscription.

Unfortunately, the pandemic cancelled our hopes to staff one of the Placer County polling sites this November. We couldn't raise the \$750 we anticipated for that effort. Neither can we anticipate raising money with the alwayspopular Petra dinner this year.

Many of our mission-based programs – Tech Trek, STEM Trek, Girls State - were cancelled or modified. It is unlikely that these programs will be able to physically meet again this year. Funds for these programs are being held for future programs; we consider these programs funded for the next event.

Despite the challenges they face to attend college this year, our scholarship recipients are resilient (as we would expect of them) and two of three young women have already requested their awards. We made commitments to award a total of \$4,000 to the three women this year. If all the requests are granted, the balance in the TTCF Donor Advised Fund Scholarship subaccount will be less than \$4,000.

Looking forward, we will re-examine our pledge to local scholarship recipients of \$5,000/year as the FY 2021-22 budget is developed. It was March 2018 when the Leadership team decided to increase the first-year award to \$2,000 with continued awards of \$1,000 each of three subsequent years (assuming the young woman continues STEM studies with a B or better GPA). We recognize college costs are rising and hope to financially support local scholars. Please let your leaders know if you have suggestions for our scholarship program.

A copy of the FY2020-21 Budget and Actual accounting is attached to this newsletter on pages 5-7. As always, I welcome your questions and comments.
