End of Year Reminder

The AAUW Orinda-Moraga-Lafayette (OML) branch notified our branch and many other branches that it had created a STEM webinar series specifically for <u>Tech Trekkers in high</u> <u>school</u>. Branch coordinators were asked to invite our former Trekkers to participate in the webinars.

The first webinar was held on Sunday, November 22, 2020, with a topic of *"Engineering with a Purpose"*, with Adrienne Johnson, a former trekker from the OML branch, who was raised in Pleasant Hill.



Adrienne received her B.S. in Civil Engineering and M.S in Sustainable Design & Construction from Stanford University. She is a Project Engineer at Point Energy Innovations in San Francisco.

While getting her Master's degree at Stanford, Adrienne co-led a team of all female engineers in a Net Zero Energy project to design, fundraise and build the Parkwood Tech Center at a primary school in Cape Town, South Africa, in a community disadvantaged by the legacy of apartheid. For her leadership, she and a co-lead earned the prestigious Malcolm Lewis IMPACT Award from the U.S. Green Building Council (USGBC) in 2017. Adrienne is considered one of the top "20 to Watch: Women in HVAC" for her achievements in designing sustainable buildings.

She is a member of Society of Women Engineers (SWE), Engineers for a Sustainable World (ESW), National Society of Black Engineers (NSBE), U.S. Green Building Council (USGBC) and others.

As a <u>Fitwel Ambassador</u>, she participates in Fitwel's healthy building movement connecting design and wellness and working to integrate the best strategies that science can offer to optimize health within a building or community.

Adrienne's presentation was candid, professional, uplifting and informative. In school, she enjoyed math, science and art and considered becoming a doctor. A career in engineering was not on the horizon. Her interest in engineering only came midway through college and was fostered by two special experiences:

- Taking an architectural drawing class that required sketching buildings around campus and made her see them in a new light.
- Studying abroad in Berlin where she was introduced to sustainable buildings.

She is passionate about sustainable buildings and particularly their potential to alleviate issues of socioeconomic inequalities.

I hope some of our local girls tuned in to this webinar. All of our former trekkers, either campers, alternates or nominees, were notified twice about the webinar. A couple of girls replied and perhaps they also registered. If they watched, they would surely be impressed.

In other Tech Trek news, branch coordinators were sent a survey from State coordinators Susan Negrete and Alice Hill, to forward to our participating school regarding the school's ability to assist with the <u>electronic nominating process</u> for the 2021 camps. North Tahoe School Principal Chad Lindeen replied to me the same day I sent the survey that he submitted the survey and asked our two nominating teachers to do the same. Chad said he would support his teachers in whatever way he could with the selection process. At the request of the 7th grade science teacher, I also emailed the survey to the STEAM coordinator at school. The nominating process will begin in January 2021.
