- Three of our five 2020 Tech Trek girls have applied for the 2021 Virtual Tech Trek camp.
- A Big Thank You to the three 7th grade teachers from North Tahoe School, including a new teacher from the school's STEAM program, who nominated 9 girls to apply this year for the virtual camp. Only 5 girls applied however.
- Cheryl, Kathie, Christine and Meri spent a rewarding afternoon interviewing these 5 girls for the 5 spots our branch has in the 2021 Virtual TT camp.
- It was perhaps the least stressful interview session, perhaps Ever, because all the girls were selected to attend camp; no alternates, no rejections. Yay!

- Costs are \$400/girl. Our branch will request a \$20 parent contribution.
