

In May, two training sessions were offered online for <u>Social Coaches</u> volunteering for <u>Virtual Tech Trek</u>. In the "gallery" photos, I saw <u>Patricia Watters</u> from our branch, and from South Lake branch, Jan Lynds, plus our UC Davis coordinator Martha Rees from Grass Valley. The level of training and thought going into VTT continues to amaze me, as well as the level of commitment from AAUW women!

AAUW National recently launched <u>STEMEd for Girls</u>, a new program designed for <u>high school girls</u>, with a particular focus on girls of color, and for their parents/caregivers who support their dreams and aspirations.

 All 5 of our 2021 campers registered, and 4 of our 2020 Tech Trek campers also registered for the VTT camp. One family registered 30 minutes before the close of registration! The number of emails and online forms demanded one's attention, but normally the paperwork is extensive too, and we have none of that this year.
