



#### PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Last month, I asked all of you to brainstorm ideas for some new activities or events for our branch. Some of us would like to start a **Speech Trek Program** for our local high school students. Last year's AAUW

California Speech Trek finalists were very inspiring, and we want to encourage more young people to explore public speaking and advocating a position on a substantive issue.

Go to the AAUW California website Speech Trek page to watch and listen to contestants from the past few years. If you would like to join our AAUW North Tahoe Speech Trek Committee, please email me now, and I will send you a link to a Zoom chat that the Committee is having on Monday, October 4th @ 9:00 AM to plan our path forward.

The 2021-2022 topic for students to write and speak about is:

Has the United States lived up to its pledge of "liberty and justice for all"? Would requiring the study of diversity, equity and inclusion in a high school setting help ensure liberty and justice for all?

Another amazing event that we can participate in is <u>Lunafest</u>, an annual traveling <u>film festival by and about women</u> that the Luna Bar company started in 2001. Over the past 20 years, the festival has celebrated and shared the work of

170 women filmmakers and raised over \$6 million for local women's causes.

Before the pandemic, the festival traveled to cities across the United States for live screening events that were also fundraisers for the sponsoring local nonprofit. Last year, the festival screenings were all virtual, and I attended the AAUW Tahoe Nevada's screening and fundraiser of Lunafest 2020. It was fabulous and fun to watch the work of inspiring and thought-provoking women filmmakers and their subjects.

Lunafest 2021 has 7 short films and a total run time of 86 minutes. Our sister branch AAUW Tahoe Nevada is once again holding a virtual screening of Lunafest as a <u>fundraiser for its Scholarship Fund</u>. Here is how it works...you signup and pay for Tahoe Nevada's screening of the festival (\$30), and the 86 minutes of films are available for you to watch via streaming to your home over a 48-hour-time period starting on Friday night, <u>November 5th at 4:30 PM</u> until Sunday, <u>November 7th at 4:30 PM</u>. After you sign up, you will receive instructions on how to access and watch the films.

It would be great if some of us could create a virtual watch party for this year's Lunafest 2021, after which we can hold our own <u>AAUW North Tahoe discussion of the films</u> the following week on a date and time TBD. We can also consider whether we would like to hold a AAUW North Tahoe screening in 2022 as our own fundraiser.

Please email me if you are interested in attending Lunafest 2021, and we will figure out the particulars together.
