I mentioned to some of you that I was going to attend a Stanford Continuing Studies webinar entitled "Wintertime Mindset: Norwegian Strategies for Enjoying Winter" by Health Psychologist Kari Liebowitz, Ph.D.

Dr. Liebowitz started by covering the idea of mindsets, which some of you may have read about in <u>Carol Dweck's</u> book "Mindset: The New Psychology of Success" and how it has been observed in students who flourish or fail. Dweck describes two basic mindsets: fixed and growth, and how people with a fixed mindset believe their abilities are fixed traits that can't be changed and give up if they don't get something easily, whereas **growth mindset** people keep trying and put in the time and effort to learn and grow.

Liebowitz used the idea of mindsets when studying how people approach the idea of seasons, and winter in particular, and how mindsets play a powerful role in health and wellbeing. When you think of winter, are you filled with gloom and dread, or do you look forward to what you can do and see outside that is unique to the winter season?

People attended the webinar from all over the world, and I found it interesting how some attendees felt undone by rain in the winter — having just lived through our big December snowstorms, the idea of rain made me want to grab my umbrella and sing as I splashed through puddles!

In addition to focusing on the enjoyable things that you can do and see outside in winter, another positive approach is to make your home life cozy, warm, and comforting, from food and beverages to snuggly clothes and blankets and soothing hobbies. Think about how you can harness your mindset to enjoy the winter season!

And to bring this back to AAUW, how can you use some of your cozy and contemplative winter hours inside to further our mission?

AAUW-CA suggested that branches consider including former campers in the interview process, and we welcome **Marion Snideman** (daughter of our member <u>Maria Snideman</u>) who has agreed to join our Tech Trek interview team.

Marion attended UC Davis TT camp as a student from the Sierra Expeditionary Learning School in Truckee and is currently a sophomore at North Tahoe High School, enjoying STEM and other AP classes. Thank you, Marion!

<u>Dianne Owens</u>, President of AAUW-CA State Board of Directors, announced that "After a great deal of thoughtful discussion, the board made the decision that our Tech Trek program will always include a <u>state-wide virtual camp option with a standardized curriculum</u>. In other words, the board endorsed having a single type of virtual camp instead of versions at each site.

The advantages of a standardized virtual camp are consistency of the camp experience, more

efficient use of resources, more manageable volunteer requirements, a unified presence for donors, and avoiding unnecessary duplication of effort.

It is not the board's intention that the virtual option will ever replace our beloved residential camps. But, for 2022, our traditional program will be dependent on campus availability and, of course, the state of the pandemic. We are certainly working hard to host residential camps but are grateful to have a virtual alternative with a volunteer to direct it.

The curriculum of the standardized virtual camp is still being developed and it is my hope that our Tech Trek stakeholders will contribute their talents to enhancing the experience we were able to offer in 2021."

The UC Davis TT camp that our girls attend has been scheduled for **July 17-23, 2022**. We cannot rule out this could change due to the coronavirus pandemic. At this time, our UCD camp is one of only two camps scheduled in California, out of 10 residential college camps convened previously. Planning a standardized virtual camp will assure Tech Trek continues in 2022.

At my request, <u>Martha Rees</u> (UC Davis cocoordinator) sent me the information and procedures for starting a <u>Tech Trek Alumnae</u> <u>Group</u>, which some of our former campers have expressed interest in. The campers run the group with guidance and support from branch mentors.

Heather Segale, Outreach and Education Director for UC Davis Tahoe Environmental Research Center (TERC) in Incline Village, would love to host a girls STEM Trek Day event with us once TERC reopens. They follow the same protocols as UC Davis, so if our TT camp moves forward, then a STEM Trek Day may also.

Many of us Zoomed our November meeting to observe the work done by the **Truckee River Watershed Council** (now called **Foriver**). Some of our members have participated in some of the TRWC's programs to improve water quality and habitat in our beautiful landscapes. Many of us have participated in <u>Truckee River Day</u>, a one-day clean-up event held every October.

Just a few hours of your time over the course of a year will help reduce river and stream water temperatures by restoring riparian areas. TRWC offers an initial training session in **May 2022**. They will also provide an exclusive training session for interested members of our branch.
