


## PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

# **SCHOLARSHIP**

The branch leadership agreed to revise our AAUW NT STEM Scholarship Program, beginning with the new award for a worthy graduating high school senior in June 2022. Owing to a downward trend in contributions to the STEM Scholarship Fund, future awards would be reduced from \$5,000 allocated over four years to a <u>one-time</u> award of \$2,000 for the awardee's first year. The scholarship will continue to go to a highly qualified young woman who has focused on STEM subjects in the North Tahoe High School attendance area, is committed to majoring in a STEM subject at a four-year college or university and has demonstrated financial need.

During the upcoming academic year 2022-23, our branch will continue to support three talented young women at: the University of Arizona, Tucson; UC

Riverside; and Loyola Marymount University, in addition to a new awardee to be selected soon.

As of June 2022, outstanding commitments to our three existing STEM Scholarship recipients, together with our new June 2022 awardee, will total **\$8,000**.

**Tax-deductible donations** to our STEM Scholarship Fund are welcome at membership renewal in May 2022.

Following the Technology section, teams of girls will create design-based learning projects of a "Never Before Seen Marina".
