







PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

I hope many of you were able to watch and participate in at least part of our AAUW California Annual

Meeting via Zoom on Saturday, April 30th, and felt a swelling of pride and inspiration to be associated with such an incredible group of state-wide AAUW members and supporters!

Representative **Jackie Speier** (California's 14th Congressional District on the San Francisco Peninsula, where I used to live) was honored as this year's AAUW California Equity Champion.

Jackie has been one of my heroes since the Jonestown, Guyana, massacre in November 1978 when she was a congressional staffer for Congressman Leo Ryan and part of his fact-finding mission to investigate allegations of human rights abuses by Jim Jones and his Peoples Temple followers.

After Congressman Ryan and 4 others were assassinated in Guyana on that terrible November day, in addition to the suicide by poison of over 900 Peoples Temple followers, Jackie was shot five times and laid on the Guyana airport tarmac for 22 hours before help arrived. Whenever I think something is too hard to do or accomplish, to summon my own hope and persistence, I think of Jackie on that tarmac and the courage and endurance human beings are capable of during extreme fear and suffering.

Jackie has gone on to champion many public policy and legislative initiatives that are key supports for AAUW's mission.

More meeting highlights: AAUW National's CEO Gloria Blackwell reminded us that what we say and do as individuals is important, and it is even more impactful when we work together to achieve change that affects broad swaths of Americans, especially through public policy advocacy and change.

Jasmine L. Sadler, who combines her love of dancing with her scientific career as owner and founder of The STEAM Collaborative, illustrated how significant our STEM programs can be for young girls and women.

During presentations by the three branches that were chosen to receive *Branch Activity of the Year Awards*, we found out what extraordinary activities and events ordinary branches just like North Tahoe can achieve through vision, creativity, and hard work.

Listening to the broadcasts of the three <u>Speech Trek</u> finalists' speeches, I thought about how important it is for us to be quiet and really listen to each other and reflect on what has been said to gain a sense of how we each have different perspectives shaped by our own experiences and ambitions.

Taking advantage of Zoom's breakout room functionality, attendees were able to participate in live discussions in two different workshop sessions during the day. Eighteen (18) different workshops were offered, and I chose to participate in two topics that are important and challenging issues, namely, abortion rights and critical race theory.

I encourage each of you to view all or parts of the 2022 AAUW California Annual Meeting when the recording is released in a few days.
