



#### PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

AAUW California launched the virtual **Gov Trek** Program on Saturday morning, January 28<sup>th</sup>, and it was a

fantastic first session.

Congressional Speaker of the House Emerita and Californian Nancy Pelosi addressed the group with a video message that was inspirational. A group of five women who work in the public policy arena participated in an hour-long panel discussion, and answered questions about their careers and how they got to where they are today. The panel included: Kathleen Van Osten, AAUW California Advocate and Lobbyist; Ellen Montanari, Deputy Campaign Manager for Representative Mike Levin; Regina Luzincourt, Lobbyist and former Press Secretary for State Senator Parker; Shana Hazan, VP San Diego Unified School Board; and Griselda Ramirez, Senior Director of Community Engagement and Partnerships, Office of San Diego County Board of Supervisor Chair Nora Vargas. Each of these women had stellar information and advice to share with the Gov Trek students, who have been formed into groups of six to work together on a Political Campaign Project over the next three virtual sessions.

During the first Gov Trek session, each group of six students met in a Zoom Breakout Room to introduce themselves to each other as the first step towards working on their <u>Political Campaign Project</u>. From our North Tahoe Branch, **Barbara Ramsey** and **I** were <u>Volunteer Facilitators</u> in the Zoom Breakout Rooms to help the girls accomplish their assigned tasks. The high school students who have signed up for Gov

Trek are an impressive lot and make me feel excited and hopeful about our future with some of them in leadership roles one day!

I learned a lot about public policy advocacy and government work from today's Gov Trek session. You can look at the Gov Trek Syllabus here: Gov Trek Syllabus 2023. The topics and speakers on **February 11**<sup>th</sup> will be: <u>Government 101</u>, **Miranda Drolet**, Sacramento County Deputy District Attorney; <u>How Local Government Really Works</u>, **Summer Stephan**, San Diego County District Attorney, & **Anne Marie Schubert**, Former Sacramento County District Attorney; <u>How State Government Really Works</u>, **Fiona Ma**, California State Treasurer; <u>How Federal Government Really Works</u>, Congresswoman **Anna Eshoo**, California 18<sup>th</sup> Congressional District.

The culmination of Gov Trek will be a Campaign Competition. Each of the groups of six students will submit a <u>Political Campaign Package</u> by March 18<sup>th</sup>, which will be evaluated by a panel of three industry judges.

Competition winners will be announced at our Saturday, April 22<sup>nd</sup>, AAUW California Annual Event and will include the following awards: Best Overall Campaign; Voter Outreach Plan (VOP) – Most Persuasive – You Got Our Vote!; Candidate Flier & Campaign Ad – Best Digital Collateral; Speech – Most Impact; Political Messaging – Most Effective; and People's Choice Award.

I am in awe of our fellow AAUW California members who planned, organized, and are now running the Gov Trek Program, and I am so thankful to belong to an organization that takes action to help create a better future for us all.

# **SCHOLARSHIP**

In FY 2021-22, our North Tahoe AAUW STEM Scholarship was a one-year award of \$2,000.

Owing to the generous donations from our members in 2022, our branch is positioned to increase this scholarship award to \$3,000 for FY 2022-23. In January 2023, our Leadership team approved this \$1,000 increase in the scholarship award for a highly qualified young woman pursuing STEM studies at a four-year college. This merit- and needs-based scholarship will be awarded in June 2023 to a deserving graduating senior residing in the North Tahoe High School attendance area. This one-year scholarship amount will be reviewed annually and adjusted as needed.

We encourage our members to continue donating generously to our **STEM Scholarship Fund** so that we can maintain a robust one-year scholarship program, while fulfilling existing commitments (through 2025) to our two remaining recipients under the earlier multi-year scholarship program.

The Tahoe Truckee Scholarship Committee is busy setting up the application process for 2023 graduating seniors. Their applications will be submitted by March 2023, and our evaluation will begin in April 2023.
