Creamy Parsnip Soup Recipe

(shared by Dianne Lange)

serving 4-6

1 medium well-cleaned, chopped leek, or onion, peeled and chopped

2 ounces (4 Tablespoons) unsalted butter

1 teaspoon fine sea salt

1 clove garlic

2 pounds parsnips, peeled and chopped

4 cups chicken broth or vegetable broth

2 cups low-fat or whole milk

Dash freshly ground black pepper or white pepper to taste

Chopped fresh herbs such as chervil, parsley or chives

Melt the butter in large pot over medium heat. Add chopped leek or onion and salt and cook, stirring until a bit creamy looking, about 10 minutes, adjusting the heat so they cook but do not brown.

Add the garlic and cook till fragrant- about 1 minute.

Add parsnips and broth, bring to a boil. Reduce heat to maintain a steady simmer and cook until parsnips are v-e-r-y tender to the bite, about 20 minutes.

Puree the soup till very smooth.

Note: Easiest way is to use a handheld immersion blender.

Caution: Steam expands quickly if alternatively, you are working in batches with a blender or food processor. *Steam can cause ingredients to splatter everywhere or cause burns*. To prevent this, fill blender only 1/3 full - vent the top, and cover with a folded kitchen towel while blending.

Whirl each 1/3 batch till utterly smooth. For a truly ultrasmooth soup, strain through a fine-mesh sieve.

Return soup to pot and add the milk at gentle heat, stirring until nice and hot all the way through. Do not let boil as it will curdle the milk. Season to taste. Serve hot with garnishes of choice.
