We are especially pleased that Alenka Vrecek, the author of She Rides: Chasing Dreams Across California and Mexico, will be speaking at our September book discussion meeting! The meeting will be held at the Tahoe Yacht Club from 12:00 noon to 2:00 PM – Lunch

and general conversation from 12:00 to 12:30 and book discussion led by Sharon Ekin and Alenka Vrecek from 12:30 to 2:00. Bring your own lunch and be prepared to learn more about Alenka's transformational journey, <u>riding her mountain bike</u> on remote mountain trails from Lake Tahoe to La <u>Ventana, Mexico</u> near the tip of the Baja Peninsula. During her epic ride, she climbed 158,263 feet, which is like scaling Mount Everest from sea level to summit nearly five and a half times. She rode 2,524 miles in 57 days. The trip was both a physical and inner journey and was the accomplishment of a dream and a promise she had made to herself.
