Here are some specs on iPal:

She has a speaker, touch sensor, camera, LED facial expression, microphone, 6" LCD display screen, 14 movement sensors with 14 degrees of freedom. She has an Android OS and is programmed with stories, songs and more, and able to connect to the Internet. She is 41" tall, weighs 27 lb., and speaks 5 languages. She was designed as a companion for young and elderly. She's adorable!

Here is the best part! iPal has a new friend and handler. Her name is <u>Rose</u>, she is a former Tech Trekker now in high school, her mom is Valerie Lease, a TT branch coordinator in Auburn. Rose

agreed to learn all about iPal and have her ready to be a greeter at the 2024 UCD TT camp next July! Martha and I think this is Perfect! Yay!


INTEREST GROUPS
