# Dr. Jeanne Plumb to Speak at Soup Luncheon on February 8



"Body image, eating disorders and emerging trends". Dr. Jeanne Plumb will discuss a brief history of definitions of beauty, the risks of

extremes of weight, emerging science that biology and genetics play a large role in disorders of size (not willpower) and the HAES (Health at Every Size) movement in body acceptance.

Dr. Jeanne Plumb is a Family Physician practicing in the North Tahoe area since 2004. She grew up in Southern California and completed her B.S. degree in biochemistry at Cal Poly San Luis Obispo. She worked as an Emergency Medical Technician then attended medical school at St. George's University School of Medicine. Dr. Plumb completed her Family Medicine residency, as Chief Resident, at the University of Nevada in Reno. In 2004 she moved to North Tahoe where she worked at North Tahoe Family Care in Incline Village for two years then she joined Truckee Tahoe Medical Group in Tahoe City, Truckee and Olympic Valley. She continues to work in these locations, now operated by Tahoe Forest Health System, practicing in Urgent Care.

Dr. Plumb teaches sports medicine fellows at the Olympic Valley office and previously served as a volunteer clinical faculty member at the UC Davis School of Medicine. She is a volunteer team physician for the US Ski and Snowboard Team. Dr. Plumb enjoys outdoor sports, raising her two teenage children with her husband and travel.

The MOU lists branch volunteers as <u>Priscilla M</u>, UCD Dorm mom, <u>Meri M</u>, UCD Visit Day coordinator, and Cheryl A, coach for Virtual TT. Did we miss anyone?

**Reminder:** TT camps, residential or virtual, need staff plus volunteers at all levels. Please consider if you can offer your talents, a little or a lot, to the Tech Trek camp experience at UC Davis or any of the camps; contact Meri if you can. UC Davis Tech Trek camp is July 14-20, 2024; Virtual camp is July 21-26, 2024. Join the fun, help make it happen!

Registration by the parents, and application and essay by the girls, are all completed online with the CampDoc platform. AAUW-CA TT Director Dr. Mary Isaac holds online 'office hours' weekly for teachers, parents and branches to understand the CampDoc platform.

After the parents and girls submit responses to CampDoc, I schedule interviews for the girls at school. Our fabulous interview team this year is <u>Priscilla</u>, <u>Cheryl</u>, <u>Maria Snideman</u> and me. The one day interview process is fun and eye-opening, but the selection process can be grueling! Interviews will probably happen in early March.

The annual STEM Trek Day is currently under review. The 5-branch committee is looking to move the event to the Fall; and I have asked

the Tahoe NV committee members to assume leadership. Stay tuned!

NT High School junior and TT alumna <u>Vallerie</u> <u>Laguna</u> joined me recently for the presentation by <u>Dr. Katharine Hayhoe</u> at TERC. Last week we both got her book 'Saving Us' and she signed them after her talk. Dr. Hayhoe captivated a room full of scientists and concerned residents with her depth of knowledge and sheer joyful optimism about tackling the climate crisis. The crisis is real, and the solutions are attainable by each of us taking action for the things we care about: our families, nature, food; skiing, fishing, whatever.
