Our AAUW group was one of the first organizations that I joined after moving in 1980 to North Lake Tahoe from Sunnyvale, CA in the heart of Silicon

Valley and close to Stanford Medical Center. My first job was in Biochemistry Research at the Medical Center and when we moved to Tahoe I looked for another research position. There was none to be found. I then volunteered in our 8 year old son Ryan's KBE 4th grade class and did a fundraiser, the Walkthon which subsequently raised \$30K+ annually (where AAUW members volunteered in the early days).

I founded a non-profit *Arts For the Schools* in 1984, where AAUW members volunteered and attended performances at Chuck Bluth's Cal Neva Frank Sinatra's Showroom. My first performance there and for our school children was Ballet Hispanico of NYC.

In the early days of our AAUW group I volunteered for many committees. After we built our present house 22 yrs ago, I held many general meetings with speakers, book group and committee meetings. I held a VP position, and at that time I was in charge of finding speakers. A memorable meeting was Dave Antonucci on Lake clarity and another was Bill Briner and his photos of the 1960s Winter Olympics at Squaw Valley Ski Resort. Both were long-time locals who knew the heart of Lake Tahoe history. We then had a book signing of both speakers at Rosie's Cafe for the general public.

Significant committees which I supported monetarily in their early days were Tech Trek and Stem Trek. Back then we held luncheons that we made and purchased at the old Tahoe City Recreation Center for our Trekkers and all interested girls who applied. We had many professional women speakers on that day (Carol Eyre's daughter was one of them). We also had a former Trekker (who became a Scientist) as a speaker. She invited her parents and grandparents to hear her. It has been my privilege to be a part of this amazing organization.

I think I joined NTAAUW in 2015. I had been a member of the Incline branch for years, serving as Secretary there. Since I was living with my partner, Marvin

Jacoby, in Incline, joining that group was most convenient. serious hikes. There were quite a few responses to the first email invite, but there were only three of us on the first walk in Tahoe City — Rachel Swift, Esther Sonnenberg, and me. However, the small showing didn't deter me. I decided to keep the walks going for a few months to see if others would join us, and they did. Even those who are serious hikers enjoy the walks, which are mostly local. Now, some of the walks have a dozen members showing up and sometimes just four, but it's always fun and gives us quality time with each other. I was so happy to see so many new members join the group this year. And I know Rachel, Jo Ann and Priscilla will keep it going. The North Tahoe branch — and the Interest Groups — are one of the Tahoe treasures I will miss the most.

the AAUW Book Group will convene poolside at **Dollar Point Association Pool and Tennis Courts** at 170 Observation Drive, Tahoe City.






Directions from Kings Beach/Carnelian Bay:

Follow Hwy 28 towards Tahoe City. Turn left onto Dollar Drive just after Chinquapin and before the 7-11 (there is a sign indicating "Dollar Drive" as you come over the Chinquapin hill). Go 1 block and turn right onto Observation Drive. The pool is on the left on the first block of Observation.

Directions from the West Shore /Tahoe City:

Follow Hwy 28 north of Tahoe City for 2 miles. Immediately after the 7-11 turn right onto Dollar Drive. Go 1 block and turn right onto Observation Drive. The pool is on the left on the first block of Observation.

There is parking all along the pool and tennis courts. If those spots are filled there is plenty of street parking. Enter through the gate with the sign "Dollar Point Swimming and Tennis Club." Check in with DPA staff as a guest of the Linda Dunne party, or just head straight across the lawn to our group.
