Here are some statistics from Pew Research about the percentages of women in some professional fields in the US, comparing 2010 to 2024:

	2010	2024
Physicians	30%	38%
Engineers & Architects	13%	15%
Attorneys	31%	39%
College & Univ. Presidents	24%	30%
Fortune 500 Members	14%	30%
State Legislators	24%	31%
US Senators	16%	23%
US Representatives	15%	27%

While we still have a long way to go (especially in engineering and architecture), I find these numbers very encouraging! AAUW North Tahoe members can feel that we're actively contributing to this positive growth, thanks to our Girls State and Tech Trek programs, our STEM college scholarships, and our donations to the AAUW Fund. Our daughters and granddaughters will see these numbers grow closer to 50%!

Primary consideration is given to women pursing their first advanced degree or credentials in education, health, and medicine, science, technology, engineering and math (STEM).

Selected Professions Fellowship Programs

promotes gender equity for women by providing funding in support of those pursuing a full-time course of study in targeted degree programs where women's representation has traditionally been low.

General Eligibility and Preferred applicants:

- First in their family to attain a bachelor's degree.
- From or lead single parent household.
- From or attending graduate school in West Virginia, Louisiana, Mississippi, Nevada, Kentucky Oklahoma, Alabama, Tennessee or Indiana.



BOOK GROUP

On Tuesday November 26th, the Book Group will meet at the Tahoe Yacht Club from 12 to 2 pm. <u>Cheryl Allen</u> will lead our discussion on the book, *The Heaven and Earth Grocery Store* by James McBride. Danez Smith of *The New York Times Book Review* describes the book as "A murder mystery locked inside a Great American Novel...Charming, smart, heart-blistering, and heart-healing." It was named a Best Book Of The Year by NPR/Fresh Air, *Washington Post, The New Yorker*, and *Time Magazine*. Also it was one of Barack Obama's favorite books of 2023.



This novel is about small-town secrets and the people who keep them. The story begins with the discovery of a skeleton at the bottom of a well. Who the skeleton was and how it got there were two

of the long-held secrets kept by the residents of Chicken Hill, the dilapidated neighborhood where immigrant Jews and African Americans lived side by side and shared ambitions and sorrows. As these characters' stories overlap and deepen, it becomes clear how much the people who live on the margins of white, Christian America struggle, and what they must do to survive. When the truth is finally revealed about what happened on Chicken Hill and the part the town's white establishment played in it, McBride shows us that even in dark times, it is love and community heaven and earth—that sustain us.

This will be a hybrid meeting. If you can't attend in person, you can join us remotely via Zoom. We will send a Zoom link in advance for anyone who would prefer to join the discussion from home.




